As an important part of the Central Africa Sustainable Investment Spark Program, the Kakuma Refugee Camp Sandbox Incubation Project in Kenya will solicit business plans from micro and small enterprises both inside and outside the refugee camp.

Through the review of authoritative institutions, representative projects with pioneering influence will be selected for support, and on-the-ground inspections and project docking by China-Africa enterprises will be carried out to encourage the development of commercial innovation projects within the refugee camp.

Kakuma Refugee Camp is one of the largest refugee camps in Africa. It is not only a refuge for hundreds of thousands of refugees but also a vibrant and creative community.

The Kakuma Refugee Camp Sandbox Incubator is an innovative business support platform designed specifically for the thriving renewable energy micro and small enterprises within Kakuma Refugee Camp. Although these enterprises are full of potential, they are often limited by a lack of resources, professional guidance, and difficulties in market docking. The core mission of the incubator is to provide these enterprises with the necessary support and guidance to help them overcome the challenges of the early stages of entrepreneurship and make the leap from concept to market.

Project Purpose

- Innovative Recruitment: To create employment opportunities for refugees.
- (apacity Building: To provide training and mentorship support for refugee entrepreneurs.
- (a) Investor Engagement: To connect projects with investors to obtain financial support.
- Sustainable Integration: To ensure projects are innovative and sustainable.
- **Empowerment and Social Inclusion: To foster self-reliance and social integration, and cultivate sustainable business practices.**





Project Solicitation Process and Timeline:

- July 2024: Project Preparation and Readiness Phase, attracting local and international partners and sponsors.
- August 2024: Open applications for members of the refugee community and screen based on criteria
- September 2024: Hold seminars to provide presentation and pitching training for finalists; offer one-on-one coaching for the finalists.
- October 2024: Finalist Showcase, facilitating interaction between finalists, sponsors, and investors.
- November 2024: Award Ceremony, providing ongoing support and resources for the winners.
- December 2024: Evaluation and feedback collection.

For 10 winners: \$1,500 worth of solar power kits and cash, plus an investment letter.

Pioneering Excellence Award

For 17 winners: \$1,000 worth of solar power kits and cash, plus an investment letter.

Inspirational Innovator Award

For 3 grand prize winners: \$2,000 worth of solar power kits and cash, plus an investment letter.
